Product description:

The PERT S3 is a high-quality 3-layer pipe specifically designed for heating applications, particularly for casted underfloor heating systems. Roth PERT S3 fulfills all the necessary requirements for an underfloor heating pipe, ensuring optimal performance and reliability. The pipe is flexible and easy to work with, even in cold weather.

To ensure consistent quality and adherence to standards, production of the PERT S3 takes place at Roth's own German factories. The manufacturing process is rigorously quality assured in accordance with ISO 9001, guaranteeing the highest level of product excellence and reliability.

The PERT S3 pipe is available in the dimensions 16mm and 20mm allowing for compatibility with different Roth underfloor heating systems and relevant fittings.

Technical data:

The PERT S3 exhibits exceptional heat stability, allowing for a permissible operating temperature of up to 70°C (with a maximum short-term temperature of 95°C) under an operating pressure of 6 bar. Additionally, it possesses a heat-conduction capacity of 0.35 W/mK.

Engineered as a three-layer co-extruded pipe, the PERT S3 incorporates an EVOH (ethyl vinyl alcohol) oxygen barrier as the outer layer. This barrier acts as a protective shield, preventing the entry of oxygen into the system. The pipe fulfills all the necessary requirements for oxygen diffusion resistance in accordance with DIN 4726, ensuring reliable and efficient performance.

The PERT S3 is designed to provide a reliable and high-performance solution for casted underfloor heating systems. With its advanced construction and compliance with oxygen diffusion resistance standards, it offers exceptional durability, efficiency, and meets the demands of a wide range of projects.

Cut-off criteria:

All major raw materials and all the essential energy is included. The production processes for raw materials and energy flows with very small amounts (less than 1%) are not included. These cut-off criteria do not apply for hazardous materials and substances.

Allocation:

The allocation is made in accordance with the provisions of EN 15804. Incoming energy and water and waste production in-house is allocated equally among all products through mass allocation. Effects of primary production of recycled materials is allocated to the main product in which the material was used. The recycling process and transportation of the material is allocated to this analysis.

Data quality:

Specific data for the product composition are provided by the manufacturer. The data represent the production of the declared product and were collected for EPD development in the year of study. Background data is based on EPDs according to EN 15804 and different LCA databases. The data quality of the raw materials in A1 is presented in the table below.

Module A1: Packaging has not been included due to several different available packaging options*.


Module A4: The transportation distances provided in this EPD are derived from precise data concerning the distances between the production facility and various sales departments in different countries. Subsequently, it is assumed that the distribution from each of these sales departments to the end customers is an approximate distance of 300 km*.

Transportation by truck is assumed distribution of 80% EURO 6 and 20% EURO 5, based on data from the company's own logistics provider.

Module A5/C1: Installation and demolition are expected to be done manually, therefore no environmental impacts are included.

Module C2: The estimated transportation distance to the waste handling facility in this EPD is 100 km, assuming the use of a truck as the transport method.
